RLI is an eight-month fellowship empowering early to mid-career professionals for lifelong community engagement and leadership through service on nonprofit boards.

Topics covered in RLI include nonprofit governance and financial management, navigating nonprofit culture, nonprofit organizational sustainability, ensuring board effectiveness, and the future of the nonprofit sector.

As fellows develop a succinct balance of nonprofit board skills, they simultaneously apply those skills through training and field experience with a nonprofit board.

Seminar topics include healthy communities, education, workforce development, transportation and trade, public safety, arts and culture, business and economics and growth and sustainability.

Fellows meet one Friday per month for eight months to gain a better understanding of the issues affecting Southern California, focused on five counties: Los Angeles, Orange, San Bernardino, Riverside and Ventura.
